VICTIMS OF CRIME ASSISTANCE (VOCA)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT CRIME VICTIM ASSISTANCE

Q. What is the Crime Victim Assistance Grant Program?

A. The Crime Victim Assistance Grant Program is administered through the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC), U.S. Department of Justice: Office of Justice Programs. Congress formally established OVC in 1998 through an amendment to the 1984 Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) to provide leadership and funding on behalf of crime victims.

Q. Where does the state get money for the Crime Victim Assistance Grant Program? Are these funds tax dollars?

A. The Crime Victim's Fund (the Fund) has been supported not by tax dollars but by fines, penalty assessments, and bond forfeitures collected from convicted federal offenders. Legislation passed in 2001 now allows the Fund to also receive gifts, donations, and bequests from private entities. OVC distributes money deposited into the Fund directly to states to support state assistance services for victims and survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, drunk driving, homicide, and other crimes.

Q. What does VOCA do?

A. Each year, the Office for Victims of Crime in the Department of Justice makes annual VOCA crime victim assistance grants from the fund to states. *The primary purpose of these grants is to support the provision of services to victims of crime.* VOCA requires programs to provide *direct services* to victims. Services are defined as those efforts that:

1. Respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims;
2. Assist primary and secondary victims to stabilize their lives after a victimization;
3. Assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; and
4. Provide victims with a measure of safety such as boarding up broken windows and replacing or repairing locks.

States and territories are required to give priority to programs serving victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse. Additional funds must be set aside for underserved victims, such as survivors of homicide victims and victims of drunk drivers. For VOCA purposes:

1. A crime victim is defined as a person who has suffered physical, sexual, financial, or emotional harm as a result of the commission of a crime.

2. Domestic violence is defined as violent acts involving a current or former spouse or domestic partner.
3. Sexual assault is defined as forcible rape, attempted rape, statutory rape, sexual harassment, prostitution, or other unlawful sexual contact and other unlawful behavior intended to result in sexual gratification or profit from sexual activity.
4. Child abuse is defined as non-accidental injury to a child (a person under the age of 18 or as otherwise defined by state law) by a parent or other adult that may include severe beatings, burns, strangulation, human bites, or a sexual offense against a child by a parent or other adult.
5. Elder abuse is defined as abuse perpetrated by a caretaker on an elderly individual who depends on others for support and assistance.

Q. How does the state get the money?

- A. The federal statute provides for the distribution of the VOCA funds. After certain amounts are distributed, of the remaining amount deposited in the fund in a fiscal year, forty-eight and one-half percent (48.5%) is available for victim assistance grants to the states. The Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement has been named by the governor as the state agency to administer these VOCA funds. LCLE must abide by the VOCA requirements and certain federal guidelines in order for the state to receive these grant funds each year.

Q. What does the state do with the grant money?

- A. Each state has sole discretion for determining which organizations will receive funds and in what amounts. LCLE established policies and procedures to manage the funds received by the state. LCLE awards the money to eligible programs in accordance with VOCA, the federal guidelines, and their policies. However, priority must be given to victims of sexual assault, spousal abuse, and child abuse. A minimum of ten percent (10%) of each federal fiscal year grant must be allocated to each of these categories or crime victims. Additionally, ten percent (10%) of each VOCA grant is allocated to victims of violent crime other than the priority areas who were previously under served.

Q. Are there any administrative funds associated with this program?

- A. Ninety-five percent (95%) of the funds are allocated for direct services to crime victims or to train direct service providers. Five percent (5%) of each year's award is used by the state agency, LCLE, to ensure that the program is administered properly and effectively.

Q. What are the VOCA requirements associated with the match requirements of Administrative/Training costs?

- A. One percent (1%) of program funds can be used for training and requires a twenty percent (20%) match. Administrative five percent (5%) is for staff to administer program only may apply to discretionary monies.

Q. What kind of programs can get an award?

- A. In order to be eligible, a program must be operated by a public agency, a private non-profit organization, or a combination of such organizations and provide services to crime victims.

Eligible organizations include victim service organizations whose sole mission is to provide services to crime victims such as domestic violence shelters, rape crisis centers, child abuse programs, and victim service units in law enforcement agencies, prosecutors' offices, hospitals, and social service agencies.

In addition to victim services organizations whose sole purpose is to serve crime victims, there are many other public and nonprofit organizations that have components which offer services to crime victims. They must use the funds to expand or enhance delivery of crime victim services. Examples are:

1. Criminal Justice Agencies such as law enforcement organizations, prosecutor offices, courts, corrections departments, probation and paroling authorities. For example, prosecutor-based victim services may include victim-witness programs, victim notification, and victim impact statements, including statements of pecuniary damages for restitution. Corrections-based victim services may include victim notification, restitution advocacy, victim-offender mediation programs, and victim impact panels. Police based victim services may include victim crisis units or victim advocates, victim registration and notification, and cellular phone and alarm services for domestic abuse victims. In general, VOCA funds may be used to provide crime victim services that exceed a law enforcement official's normal duties. Regular law enforcement duties such as crime scene intervention, questioning of victims and witnesses, investigation of the crime, and follow-up activities may not be paid for with VOCA funds.
2. Religiously-Affiliated Organizations. These must ensure that services are offered to all crime victims without regard to religious affiliation and that receipt of services is not contingent upon participation in a religious activity or event.
3. State Crime Victim Compensation Programs.
4. Hospital and Emergency Medical Facilities which offer crisis counseling, support groups, and/or other types of victim services.

5. Other State and Local Public Agencies such as mental health service organizations, state/local public child and adult protective services, state grantees, legal service agencies and programs with a demonstrated history of advocacy on behalf of domestic violence victims, and public housing authorities that have components specifically trained to serve crime victims.

Q. Are there any organizations specifically ineligible?

- A. Federal agencies and in-patient treatment facilities are specifically ineligible.

Q. What kinds of services must programs provide?

- A. The following is a list of services, activities, and costs that are eligible for support with VOCA grant funds:
 1. Immediate Health and Safety. Those services which respond to the immediate emotional and physical needs (excluding medical care) of victims such as crisis intervention; accompaniment to hospitals for medical examinations; hotline counseling; emergency food, clothing, transportation, and shelter (including emergency, short-term nursing home shelter for elder abuse victims for whom no other safe, short-term residence is available); and other emergency services that are intended to restore the victim's sense of dignity, and self esteem. This includes services which offer an immediate measure of safety such as boarding-up broken windows and replacing or repairing locks. Also allowable is emergency legal assistance such as filing restraining orders and obtaining emergency custody/visitation rights when such actions are directly connected to family violence cases and are taken to ensure the health and safety of the victim.
 2. Mental Health Assistance. Those services and activities that assist the primary and secondary victims of crime in understanding the dynamics of victimization and in stabilizing their lives after a victimization such as counseling, group treatment, and therapy.
 3. Assistance with Participation in Criminal Justice Proceedings. In addition to the cost of Emergency Legal Services noted above, there are other costs associated with helping victims participate in the criminal justice system that are allowable, including:
 - a. Advocacy on behalf of victims;
 - b. Accompaniment to criminal justice offices and court;
 - c. Transportation to court;
 - d. Childcare or respite care to enable a victim to attend court;
 - e. Notification of victims regarding trial dates, case disposition information, and parole consideration procedures; and
 - f. Assistance with victim impact statements.

NOTE: Projects devoted to restitution advocacy on behalf of specific crime victims may be funded. (VOCA funds cannot be used to pay for non-emergency legal representation such as divorces or civil restitution recovery efforts.)

4. Forensic Examinations. Services for sexual assault victims, forensic exams are allowable costs only to the extent that other funding sources are unavailable or insufficient.
5. Special Services. Services to assist crime victims with managing practical problems created by the victimization such as acting on behalf of the victim with other service providers, creditors, or employers; assisting the victim to recover property that is retained as evidence; assisting in filing for compensation benefits; and helping to apply for public assistance.
6. Restorative Justice. If requested or voluntarily agreed to by the victim and if having possible beneficial or therapeutic value to crime victims, opportunities for the victim to meet with the perpetrator may be arranged. (VOCA funds cannot be used for victim-offender meetings which serve to replace criminal justice proceedings.)

Q. Regarding services available to victims, what is prohibited?

A. A recipient of VOCA funds may not use the funds for the following:

1. Property Loss. Reimbursing crime victims for expenses incurred as a result of a crime such as insurance deductibles, replacement of stolen property, funeral expenses, lost wages, and medical bills is not allowed.
2. Most Medical Costs. VOCA funds cannot pay for nursing home care, home health-care costs, in-patient treatment costs, hospital care, and other types of emergency and non-emergency medical and/or dental treatment.
3. Relocation Expenses. VOCA funds cannot support relocation expenses for crime victims such as moving expenses, security deposits on housing, ongoing rent, and mortgage payments.
4. Perpetrator Rehabilitation and Counseling. VOCA funds cannot be used to offer rehabilitative services to offenders or to support services to incarcerated individuals, even when the service pertains to the victimization of that individual.
5. Prosecution Activities. VOCA funds cannot be used for witness notification and management activities and expert testimony at trial or for victim witness protection costs and subsequent lodging and meal expenses. These are considered part of the criminal justice agency's responsibility.
6. Activities Exclusively Related to Crime Prevention.

Q. Can an agency use volunteers for the purposes of in-kind match to answer a hotline that is coded to their cell phones after hours?

A. Yes.

Q. If these programs are supposed to help crime victims with direct services, why can't they pay for medical costs or lost wages?

- A. These types of assistance would not be direct services provided by the programs but rather would be compensation for loss. There is another federal/state program which assists victims with those needs. That is the Louisiana Crime Victims Reparations Program, also administered by LCLE. Funded programs are required to assist victims with seeking compensation unless it is not applicable, as in the case of CASA programs.

Q. What is the procedure for a program that wants to apply for funds?

- A. For the purpose of distributing funds the commission administers, the state is divided into eight (8) law enforcement planning districts. The District Program Director is the point of contact between the local level and the state, and will assist any program in the funding process. Any program interested in funding should contact LCLE at (225) 925-1757 where they will be put in touch with the Program Director in their local law enforcement planning district.

Q. How does the district process work?

- A. When the commission learns of the amount of funds the state will receive, it uses a formula based on population and crime statistics to determine each district's share and then notifies the districts of the amount of grant funds available for that area. Each planning district has a council comprising local law enforcement officials and private citizens. The local districts determine need in their areas based on funding criteria established by the Victim Services Advisory Board.

The districts solicit programs annually by publishing the availability of funds in the Public Notice section of the newspaper usually in early spring. They advertise the date, time, and location of meetings where program proposals will be heard. The proposal will be reviewed first by the planning district council which must approve the proposal in order for it to proceed. If it is approved, the program is then given an application kit. The Program Director is available to assist applicants in preparing materials for submittal. The application is then sent to LCLE where it will undergo staff review before it is presented to the advisory board. The board will make a recommendation to the full commission which either approves or denies the application.

Q. If a program meets the above criteria and falls into one of those categories, are there other requirements that must be met to get funds? If so, what are they?

A. In addition to the first two criteria, the organization is operated by a public or nonprofit organization or a combination of such organizations AND it provides services to crime victims, the following eligibility criteria that must be met by all organizations that receive VOCA funds:

1. Record of Effective Services. Programs must demonstrate a record of providing effective services to crime victims. This includes having the support and approval of your services by the community, a history of providing direct services in a cost-effective manner, and financial support from other sources.
2. New Programs. Programs that have not yet demonstrated a record of providing services may be eligible to receive funding if they can demonstrate that 25% of their financial support is from non-federal sources. This support cannot be used as match.
3. Program Match Requirements. Matching funds derived from resources other than federal funds must be provided. Match can be cash or in-kind. Native American tribes/organizations located on reservations must provide five percent (5%) match. All others must provide twenty percent (20%) match.
 - a. Cash Match. Cash match (hard) includes cash spent for project-related costs. Allowable cash match includes those costs which are allowable with Federal funds with the exception of the acquisition of land, when applicable. For example, if you pay rent, this is "cash" match. If someone donates the office space, then it is "in-kind" match.
 - b. In-Kind Match. In-kind (soft) includes, but is not limited, the valuation of in-kind services. "In-kind" is the value of something received or provided that does not have a cost associated with it. For example, if in-kind match is permitted by law (other than cash payments), then the value of donated services could be used to comply with the match requirement. Examples of in-kind match are:
 - i. Personnel or Salaries.
 - ii. Expendable Equipment.
 - iii. Office Supplies.
 - iv. Workshop or Classroom Materials.
 - v. Workspace.
 - vi. Volunteers.
4. Volunteers. Volunteers must be used in the program.
5. Promote Community Efforts to Aid Crime Victims. VOCA expects public agencies and private organizations to coordinate their efforts to aid victims. This coordination may include serving on task forces, commissions, working groups; and developing written agreements which contribute to better and more comprehensive services to victims.

6. Help Victims Apply for Compensation Benefits. Programs are required to provide assistance such as identifying and notifying victims of the availability of compensation, assisting them with application forms and procedures, obtaining necessary documentation, and checking on claim status.
7. Comply with Federal Rules Regulating Grants. Program and financial records that fully disclose the amount and disposition of funds received must be maintained. This includes financial documentation for disbursements; daily time and attendance records specifying time devoted to VOCA allowable victim services; client files; the portion of the project supplied by other sources of revenue; job descriptions; contracts for services; and other records which facilitate an effective audit.
8. Maintain Civil Rights Information. Statistics must be maintained on victims served by race or national origin, sex, age, and disability. LCLE will give the program the timetable for reporting. The program must permit reasonable access to its books, documents, papers, and records.
9. Comply with State Criteria. Programs must meet any additional eligibility or service criteria established by LCLE such as submitting statistical and programmatic information on the use and impact of VOCA funds.
10. Services to Federal Victims. Services to victims of federal crimes must be provided on the same basis as those provided to victims of state/local crimes.
11. No Charge to Victims for VOCA-Funded Services. Programs must provide services to crime victims, at no charge, through the VOCA-funded project. Any deviation from this provision requires prior approval by the state grantee. The purpose of the VOCA victim assistance grant is to provide services to all crime victims regardless of their ability to pay for services or availability of insurance or other payment sources.
12. Client-Counselor Confidentiality. The program must maintain confidentiality of client-counselor information as required by state and federal law. This provision does not, however, override a state's laws on mandatory reporting of child abuse, nor does it prohibit access to a project by a federal or state agency seeking to determine if funds are being used in accordance with funding agreements.
13. Surety Bond. LCLE requires each private, non-profit program receiving funding to obtain a surety bond in the amount of the federal funds requested. Those programs which have previously received at least one year of CVA funding and which have demonstrated good performance, i.e., completing required reports, etc., will not be required to obtain a surety bond.

Q. For programs that receive funding, are there other eligible activities besides direct services to victims?

- A. The services, activities, and costs listed below are not generally considered direct crime victim services, but are often necessary and essential to ensuring direct services are provided, thus are eligible activities:

1. Skills Training for Staff. Funds can be used for training both VOCA-funded and non-VOCA-funded providers within a program so they are better able to offer quality services. Funds cannot be used for management and administrative training.
2. Lodging/Conferences & Workshops. Conferences and workshops funded through Office of Justice Program, Federal grant funds that include lodging for 30 or more participants must not exceed the Federal per diem rate for lodging. In the event the lodging rate is not the Federal per diem rate or less, none of the lodging costs associated with the event would be allowable costs to the grant award. As a result, the subgrantee would be required to pay for all lodging costs for the event, not just the amount in excess of the Federal per diem.
3. Training Materials. Materials such as books, training manuals, and videos can be purchased. The cost of a trainer for in-services staff development can also be supported. Staff from other organizations can attend in-service training activities that are held for the staff.
4. Training Related Travel. Funds can be used for travel, meals, lodging, and registration fees. Programs are encouraged to keep travel costs to a minimum.
5. Equipment and Furniture. Funds can be used to purchase items which provide or enhance direct service to victims. Funds cannot support the entire cost of an item that is not used exclusively for victim-related activities; however, funds can support a prorated share of an item. Examples of allowable items are beepers; typewriters and word processors; video-tape cameras and players for interviewing children; two-way mirrors; equipment and furniture for shelters, work spaces, waiting rooms, and children's play areas; and Braille equipment or TTY/TTD machines for the deaf, or minor building alterations/improvements that make victims services more accessible to persons with disabilities.
6. Advanced Technologies. Computers may increase a sub-recipient's ability to reach and serve crime victims. For example, automated victim notification systems have dramatically improved the efficiency of victim notification and enhanced victim security. Programs must demonstrate how computer equipment will enhance services to victims and how it will be integrated into the current system. How the related costs will be supported must also be explained.
7. Contracts for Professional Services. VOCA funds generally should not be used for contract services; however, at times it may be necessary. Examples of these services include:
 - a. Assistance in filing restraining orders or establishing emergency custody/visitation rights;
 - b. Forensic examinations;
 - c. Emergency psychological or psychiatric services; or
 - d. Sign interpretation for the hearing impaired.
8. Operating Costs. Examples of allowable costs include supplies; equipment use fees; printing, copying, postage; brochures describing available services; books and victim-related materials. VOCA funds may also support administrative time to complete VOCA-required documents, etc.

9. Supervision of Direct Service Providers. When such supervision is necessary and essential to providing direct services to victims, funds may be used. For example, it may be cost effective to support a coordinator of volunteers or interns to serve more victims.
10. Repair and/or Replacement of Essential Items. Funds can be used to repair or replace items that contribute to maintaining a healthy or safe environment for victims, such as furnace in a shelter. The expense must be carefully scrutinized to meet guidelines.
11. Public Presentations. Presentations designed to identify victims and provide or refer them to needed services are allowable. Activities and costs related to such programs can also be supported.

Q. How much time does a program have to spend a grant?

- A. Funds are available for expenditure throughout the FFY of award as well as in the next three fiscal years. The FFY begins on October 1 and ends on September 30. Therefore, grants awarded to the states in November 1996 (FFY 1997) are available for obligation beginning October 1, 1996, through September 30, 2000. While grants may be written for only one year, extensions can be obtained. Because of the time needed for awarding subgrants, for each annual federal award to the state, funded programs will have, in actual time, approximately 3 years in which to expend funds.

Q. Can VOCA Federal funds be used to pay for background checks for volunteers?

- A. VOCA Federal funds cannot be used to pay for background checks for the volunteers because Federal funds cannot be used to pay for a State mandated requirement.
